Youlgrave Post Office will close for the last time at its current premises on Fountain Square on Tuesday 7 June, when Roger Easton will formally retire after 14 years as the village's Subpostmaster. The new branch will open at Parkers stores on Church Street on Friday 10 June. For the two days that Youlgrave is without a post office you are advised to use the main branch on Granby Road in Bakewell.

From 10 June the new-look Youlgrave Post Office will open at the following times:

 Wed: 8.30am-12.30pm

The same range of services will be available as before and customers can continue to collect benefits in cash and use the everyday banking services and Post Office card account.

The premises will have level access with a wide door, and there will be a low level counter and writing desk, as well as a hearing loop and space for a wheelchair.

New look to Youlgrave Parish Council

Last month's parish council elections in Youlgrave, in which there were 16 candidates competing for ten places, has resulted in five new parish councillors.

The new Councillors are John Wragg, Graham Elliott, Brian Wardle, Mitch Blythe and Has Oldham. The five parish councillors who were re-elected are Eric Goodwin, Lillian Clark, Andrew McCloy, Lenka Kavanagh and Glenys Moore. The turnout was 57.4%.

At the subsequent Annual Meeting of Youlgrave Parish Council, Andrew McCloy was re-elected Chairman and Brian Wardle became the new Vice Chairman for the year ahead.

There was no election in Middleton and Smerrill parish, where David Mallaband, Claire Sutton and Patricia Warren were returned unopposed.

In the Derbyshire Dales District Council election for Youlgrave (Lathkill & Bradford ward), which took place at the same time, the Independent candidate David Frederickson beat his Conservative Party rival Mitch Blythe by 49 votes (390 to 349).

The result of the referendum on the Alternative Vote system in the Derbyshire Dales was a clear 'No' (20,893 votes or 70.38%) against a 'Yes' of 8,795 votes (29.62%).

Memorial Service for Christine Fielden

Chris was killed in a car accident shortly before she was due to move from Stanton to Youlgrave. There will be a memorial service in All Saints Church Youlgrave on Saturday 4 June at 3pm. Also the same day, everyone is invited to a free early evening performance by The Fishpond Choir in All Saints Church Youlgrave at 6:30pm. Anyone who wishes may donate to the Church.

Bob Skinner (1922-2011)

Ernest Robert Skinner – known as Bob – was born in Eastbourne. His father was a gardener and Bob grew up on the country estate where his father worked.

When war broke out, Bob was 17 and was working as a plumber. Plumbing was a reserved occupation which meant that he didn't have to join up, but when his exemption came up for renewal, he told his employer not to bother – he wanted to fight for his country.

He was assigned to the Royal Engineers and served in Egypt, Greece, Palestine and Italy. He was trained to operate huge bulldozers and much of his time was spent in clearing roads, bridges and tunnels bombed by the Germans. It was in Naples where he met Ron Wood, an army colleague who was to become his lifelong friend and eventually brother-in-law.

Ron was engaged to Mum's sister, Lilian, and it was through them that Bob and Peggy became pen pals. Eventually they met and were married in 1947. During the early days, they lived with Bob's parents in London but neither of them enjoyed city life and the opportunity to move back to Youlgrave arose when Bert Evans advertised for a plumber. Bob applied, got the job and worked for Bert alongside Charlie Wardle. When Bert retired, Bob started his own plumbing business which he ran from home using a pushbike to cycle to customers in and around Youlgrave.

Bob learned to drive in the army, but it wasn't until the early 60s that he was persuaded to buy an ex-GPO Morris 2

van in which he took a great pride. Hand painted green, it became a familiar sight around the village.

Bob served as a Parish Councillor for a time. He appeared in several Youlgrave pantomimes and in the early days of the Holywell players tried his hand at a spot of amateur dramatics. He loved his garden and could often be found tending his vegetables come rain or shine. For several years, he was the secretary of the Youlgrave and District Darts league.

Probably his biggest contribution to the village was his involvement in Youlgrave Waterworks Committee, of which he became a member in 1949. He spent time, energy and enthusiasm helping to ensure that Youlgrave had a consistent, clean water

supply. Many the time he would be out and about after midnight with a special listening device checking for the tell-tale sound of running water, trying to pinpoint the location of burst underground pipes. He eventually became Manager of the Waterworks and remained an active member of the Waterworks Committee long after his retirement.


He was proud to be the local standard bearer for the British Legion, a position he held for more than 50 years, and on two occasions paraded the standard at the Festival of Remembrance at the Albert Hall.

In short, he loved village life and he loved Youlgrave.

Youlgrave's **Rebekah Marsden** recently returned from a "life changing" expedition to Ethiopia, the focus of which was renovating a village school.

I would just like to say a huge thank you to everybody in the village who helped me with the fundraising for my expedition to Ethiopia. The support was extremely helpful and greatly appreciated.

The expedition was a great success and I thoroughly enjoyed every aspect of it. The three day trek through the Simien Mountains was incredible, as was the wildlife and scenery. Everybody was highly welcoming and eager to help, and the school gave us a



great reception with a welcoming ceremony, including singing, dancing, acting, coffee, popcorn and bread - this was all quite overwhelming.

The work within the school was completed well, and between the two groups we were able to fit two new taps (as well as mending the old one), plaster the outside of one of the school buildings, paint an educating mural, repair the dry stone walls and pay for the materials that will later concrete some of the classroom floors. It was



wonderful to be able to make a difference and improve an important part of many children's lives.

Despite being tiring work, I had an amazing time and loved discovering Africa, experiencing a new culture and meeting many inspiring young people.

Once again I would like to thank anybody who helped me and made the expedition possible for me - it was truly life changing. It is safe to say, I will definitely be visiting Africa again!

Physical health and well-being through Hatha Yoga

Yoga is an holistic practice for creating and maintaining balance and harmony in our lives. It has boundless potential for bringing about healing on many different levels.

The word 'yoga' is Sanskrit, meaning 'yoke' or 'union', and it refers to the union of the mind, body and spirit. Yoga is not a religion, and as such can be practiced by everyone, of all ages and backgrounds.

Hatha Yoga is the physical path, and the yoga most widely practised here in the West. It works on the muscular system to develop flexibility, as well as affecting all of the other body systems, to make the body healthy and balanced, strong, steady and stable. It does not matter how much or little we can do in a pose, or whether we can even manage a particular posture, but much more important is the quality of awareness we bring to the pose.

I have been practising yoga for many years and am presently studying for a diploma with the British Wheel of Yoga, which I am enjoying enormously. The Hatha Yoga class runs every Monday evening in term time, between 5-6.30pm, at Youlgrave Village Hall. The class is open to all abilities and beginners are particularly welcome. Youlgrave Wildlife Notes: May

The eruption of wildlife since the last article has been spectacular.

On 15 April there were just six species of plants in flower on the Playing Field Wildlife Area. On 14 May there were 25!

The summer visitor birds have all arrived, even a cuckoo at Rheinstor on 16 May. I had a report of a blackcap on a feeder on Conksbury just the day after the last Wildlife Notes, with the bit about warblers, came out. Such is the power of the Bugle!

I saw willow warbler on 18 April near Braemar Bridge, garden warbler and chaff near Raper Bridge and a redstart at Middleton. This delightful little bird is like a back to front robin with the orange-red on its rump rather than its breast.

I had a report of house martins in the village on 15 April, swallows on the 16th and swifts on 6 May. Wheatears are now quite common above the village and curlews can be heard and seen locally. I have had reports of both barn owl and tawny owl calling, as well as buzzard. Other less usual birds reported in gardens were siskin, reed bunting and spotted woodpecker. A sparrowhawk spent some time in a garden down Conksbury eyeing the bird feeder.

The fields to the left of Alport Hill as you go down have been white with meadow saxifrage, not to be confused with lady's smock which has four petals to the saxifrage's five and prefers damper places. Many local fields

looked as though they had been planted with oil seed rape, since they were so yellow with buttercups and dandelions. There are three main species of buttercup in the pastures, creeping (beloved of gardeners), meadow and bulbous. To tell them apart have a look at the display at the Playing Field Wildlife Area where there are descriptions and photos, as well as photos of other local flowers.

The lanes are lined with white cow parsley and sweet cicely. Though similar looking, sweet cicely smells strongly of aniseed.

concerns slow-worms. Following a report of the first slow-worm of the year down the Bank, it reminded me that this is a very under-recorded species, though common enough in some parts of Youlgrave. Though it looks like a snake, it is actually a legless lizard. If in doubt, if it winks at you it is a slow-worm, as

snakes don't have eyelids and lizards do. Date, place and grid reference useful.

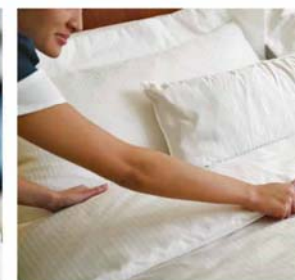
Any water vole sightings from above Holywell Lane are particularly welcome. The Braemar Bridge ones are being seen regularly.

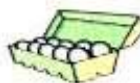

Calling All Youlgrave Bee Friends

A Bee-Spotting reminder

I think most people know what a bumble bee looks like – they're the round furry ones which tend to make a lot of noise. Honey bees are smaller, but if you look carefully you can see the pollen sacs (yes, that is how you spell it) on their back legs where they store the pollen to take back to the bee hive. There are hover flies which dress up like bees just to confuse everyone – but they have no pollen sacs. It is a fact that the colour of the pollen can tell a beekeeper exactly the kind of plant which the bees are feeding on.

Your job as a bee friend is to keep a look-out in your garden and on walks to see which plants the bees are collecting food from. Those are the plants we need to encourage and grow in our gardens and fields – and even if you don't want wild flowers in your garden, you can find a similar cultivated variety to plant, for example the blue cranesbill you see by the roadsides in summer is similar to the perennial geraniums you can buy from garden centres. And looking ahead, one of the valuable bee food plants in early spring is the wallflower, and now is the time to be sowing its seed.

'Bee Friends Container' flower competition

Talking about growing plants, cast your thoughts forward to July. Television may flaunt its Chelsea or Tatton Park Flower Shows, but you have an opportunity to share your summer blooms at the Carnival on 23 July, so start thinking about the flowers and the container you will use for them.

The Container will be part of the Carnival procession, so it will need to have its own wheels (old pram, bicycle, etc) or to be easily lifted on to a wheelbarrow – the more original the container the better.

The plants and flowers in the container will be judged on their bee friendliness. For a list of bee friendly plants see our blog at the youlgravebeegroup.blogspot.com.
