

What can a Community Land Trust do for us?

The Youlgrave Village Plan, agreed in 2009 after widespread consultation, places a high priority on maintaining a vibrant, working village through community regeneration schemes and the provision of affordable housing. So in order to generate funds to implement the plan, the Youlgrave Village Plan Group proposes to set up a community land trust. This is a legally incorporated body through which we can seek and distribute grant funding and also own land and property for the benefit of the community in perpetuity.


It will be run by a Board elected by all members of the community who support its aims and want to join. It will be 'not-for-profit' - so any surplus it makes will be ploughed back into other community projects. In the future such a Trust might run community buildings, support community projects and look after other community-owned assets. In the long-term it could, for example, maintain the post office or local shops, like in Winster, where the community now owns and runs the village shop and has saved the post office from closure.

So come to the meeting on Thursday 14 June 14 in the Village Hall and hear about how the Trust will work. Steve Watson from Devon CLT will be making a presentation about the benefits of such a project. I hope you will be able to come and support the idea and find out more about this exciting initiative for Youlgrave.

Here are some of the projects that the Youlgrave Community Land Trust could undertake:

- Secure land for the community orchard
- Secure the long-term future of local shops and post office
- Build affordable housing
- Sponsor renewable energy projects like anaerobic digestion
- Guarantee the future of Bankside Wildlife Garden
- Manage community buildings

Baden-Powell Award for Youlgrave Guides

On Thursday 17 May we were delighted to welcome our County, Area and District Commissioners to Youlgrave Guides. The reason for their visit was to present seven girls with their Baden-Powell Challenge Award. Jennifer Bristow. Camilla Clark. Hannah Corran. Olivia Hourly, Alice Marsden, Kate Worthington and Alice Yarwood have all worked incredibly hard to gain the



highest award a Guide can achieve.

To gain the Baden-Powell Award Guides have to complete ten clauses, including a range of activities such as building and sleeping in a bivouac, running evenings for the unit which have ranged from international to sports and relaxation evenings. They also took part in water activity weekends and international trips, and to complete their awards the girls had to attend a Challenge Weekend along with Guides from other units.

The girls have been with Youlgrave Guides for about six years and have contributed significantly since then, joining in with regular meetings, events and camps. They have a great sense of humour and fun, whilst becoming great leaders and an example to the younger guides. The unit and leaders are extremely proud of them and their achievements.

Youlgrave Wildlife Notes: May 2012

The summer birds have now arrived and I am grateful to Joy Frost for an excellent list of arrivals in the Conksbury Lane/Raper Lane area. She recorded a chiffchaff on 22 March, blackcap and two swallows on 12 April, a willow warbler on 17 April, swallows over her house and a blackcap singing in the garden on 20 April. She also noted curlews, probably heading

for the Greenfields area, and a sparrowhawk catching and completely stripping a collared dove in the garden. There was a very travel-worn redstart at the top of Moor Lane on 29 April. This attractive summer visitor is like a back to front robin with the orange on its rump. I have seen several since, on the pastures above the village.

On 5 May there were swallows, house martins and swifts flying over the Dale and two buzzards soaring over Mawstone. The martins seemed to have arrived after the swifts this year. On the 6th there were male and female orange tip

butterflies in the garden and, in spite of the low temperatures, there was a cloud of small insects in the lee of a cherry tree, no doubt providing some much needed food for the swallows etc.

On the 7th I walked down into the Dale. My very slow re-ascent up to Brookleton produced some very nice flowers on the bank. There was white meadow saxifrage, blue germander speedwell and buttercup. This is not the creeping buttercup so beloved of gardeners but the bulbous buttercup, one of our special limestone pasture plants. You can tell it from the

other buttercups by the sepals that bend back to touch the stem under the flower. The walls on Brookleton had blue ivy leafed toadflax, tiny white rue-leafed saxifrage and two pretty little ferns, wall rue and maidenhair spleenwort, all making the most of the aging pointing. These plants are common on similar walls around the village. I also saw two long

tailed tits in the garden.

My eco (i.e. neglected) lawn has been bright with violets and the dandelions have done their best for the bees. My common spotted orchid that thrived on neglect last year has again started to grow and I think there may be two of them this year. It will be some time before it flowers though.



adult. I haven't recorded garden warbler yet. Good places for these are by Raper Bridge or the old mill at the bottom of Roughwood Hollow.

People ask how I can tell birds by their songs. Quite simple – I cheat! I have all the British bird songs on my i-Pod. There are plenty of websites or CDs that can be downloaded and listened to in the field. Please keep those observations coming in and thanks to all contributors.
